These books, now available through NetLibrary, were added to enhance the content of the State Library's new JobSearch Program, which includes training in career skills for 270 library staff members in nine workshops at public libraries across the state. The JobSearch Program will utilize NC LIVE databases and the new eBooks to support the rising number of North Carolina job hunters. These resources are now freely available to all North Carolinians through their local public or academic libraries and through NCLIVE.
